ORAL CANCER AWARENESS

WHY WE SHOULD CARE

April was the World Oral Cancer Awareness month. Oral cancer is a highly preventable cancer, yet one of the sixth most common cancers globally, causing a major public health problem [1]. According to the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services, approximately 8,000 individuals in the US die of oral cancer annually [2].

5 REFERENCES AND CONTACT INFORMATION Several studies have established causal links between tobacco products (in any form), alcohol and Human Papilloma Viruses and development of oral and oropharyngeal cancers [2].

The majority of the time, oral cancers are asymptomatic and oral signs and symptoms may include dysplasia, leukoplakia, erythroplakia, lichen planus and submucous fibrosis [3]. Other signs and symptoms include swellings, eroded areas on the lips and gingivae, unexplained bleeding or numbness in mouth, difficulty in chewing and swallowing, change in the way dentures fit or unexplained weight loss [4].

Now is the time to spread the word about the importance of oral screening for this highly preventable oral cancer.

Dental informatics can play a significant role in improving prevention and early diagnosis of these cancers. On behalf of DI-WG, we would like to thank all the DI members who have been focusing on oral cancer informatics and working on leveraging scientific approaches in prevention, management, treatment of oral and oro-pharyngeal cancers.
